To consider a resolution canvassing the returns and declaring the official results of the City of Taylor General Election held on May 2, 2026, for the purpose of electing Mayor (at-large).

The City of Taylor held a general election on May 2, 2026, for the purpose of electing a Mayor (at-large). The election was conducted in coordination with the Williamson County Elections Department in accordance with the Texas Election Code and the City Charter.

The election returns have been verified and certified Williamson County election officials. State law requires the governing body to officially canvass the election results not earlier than the third day or later than the eleventh day after election day.

A RESOLUTION CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF TAYLOR, TEXAS ON THE 2ND DAY OF MAY 2026 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR (AT-LARGE).

WHEREAS, the City of Taylor, Texas, held an election on May 2, 2026, for the purpose of electing one person to serve as Mayor for a three-year term expiring May 2029; and

WHEREAS, presiding judges in the election districts and the presiding judge for early voting have certified to the Williamson County Elections Administrator the results of said election; and

WHEREAS, election returns for said election districts and for early voting have been duly canvassed in accordance with the law, and upon consideration, the City Council finds that said returns were duly and legally made; and
